
## International Baccalaureate Diploma Program's Projected Pathways Guide


The International Baccalaureate curriculum includes courses of six different subject groups. A Diploma Program candidate needs to enroll in one from each of the six groups, as well as the Theory of Knowledge course. The Theory of Knowledge is a two-year course offered only to Diploma Program candidates. The only course that can be substituted is Group 6, Dance, and in its place, students may take Group 3, IB Psychology as their elective. **NOTE:** These pathways do not show every course offered beyond sophomore year; it only indicates possible pathways to IB courses. Orange indicates the least encouraged path, purple suggests another possible path, and green indicates the favored pathway.


Group 1, Studies in Language and Literature: English Literature HL, 2-year course




Group 2, Language Acquisition: Spanish B SL, 1-year course to be taken year two of the program




Group 3, Individuals and Societies: History SL (Riots & Protests and The Cold War), 1-year course to be taken year one of the program



Group 4, Science: Environmental Systems & Societies HL, 2-year course



**Group 5, Mathematics:** Analysis & Approaches SL, 2-year course



Group 6, The Arts: Dance HL, 2-year course



**Group 3, Individuals and Societies:** Psychology HL, 2-year course

This course is offered as an elective for DP students who do not wish to pursue IB Dance, or this course can be taken à la carte. No prerequisites are necessary.

## **Graduation Requirements**

In order for a student to graduate and receive a high school diploma from Manasquan High School, each student must earn a minimum of 150 credits by successful completion of the prescribed courses listed in the chart and as outlined in the course descriptions and as dictated by the State of New Jersey Department of Education.
